
#### **Nursery**


Our rainbow songs have been fun to learn and we have enjoyed finding children from other schools singing them on Youtube.

#### **Reception**

Reception have been working so hard this half term to find out about 'Why Don't Snakes Have Legs?' We started our topic with a fantastic memorable experience visit from Zoolab. During the visit, we got to stroke a scaly slithery snake, watch a racing rat run, hold a snotty snail and feel a frumpy frog. In topic, we have been learning about different types of reptiles and how they all need different things to help them survive.

We have been working really well in our Read, Write Inc. to learn how to blend sounds together to help us to read new words and segment the sounds in words to use in our writing. We are ALL readers!

In our Maths work, we have been learning how to count forwards and backwards to 20, recognise numbers up to 20 and learning to write them. We are so clever that we are now beginning to find one more or less than a given number and find the total of two sets of objects. It is such an exciting time learning all these new things at school and we can't wait to practise them at home so that we can get even better at them!



#### Year 1

This half term, Year 1 have been learning about 'Superheroes!' We have had a wonderful time making ourselves into superheroes and choosing our super powers! We have read some great stories such as Traction Man, Max and Super Daisy and they have helped us produce some fabulous writing.

#### Year 3




