
Summer 1 – Can We Explore It?

We made lots of different sea


creatures using a wide range of different materials. We had to work together to make papier maché iellyfish.

#### Year 1

This half term, we have had a fantastic time learning about animals. Our topic was called 'Paws, Claws and Whiskers' and we kicked this off by visiting Wild Animal

Adventures.

When we arrived we had a tour of the centre and looked at many

different animals from bats to goats. We then went into a handling area and got to hold rabbits, guinea pigs, snakes, newts and a chameleon! Some of us were a bit frightened to hold the animals so we got to stroke them. When we returned to school, we did a lot of research on animals who live in the wild, what animals eat, where animals live, what animals look like and we thought about which animal is our

favourite.

We have continued to work hard using our phonics to read and write words this half term and we are

becoming very confident at applying our letter sounds when writing.

Next half term, our topic is 'Enchanted Woodland' and we are looking forward to going on a trip to Hardwick Park.



### Year 2

This half term, Year 2 have been learning about Pirates. We have had a great time making rafts, hats, telescopes and maps. We have also made great progress with our writing this half term using a range of sentence types. During maths, we have worked extremely hard on mastering multiplication facts and related division facts for 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables.

All of the teachers are so proud of all of the children for trying their very best on their SATS. What super stars!

We cannot wait to embark on our new topic next half term.



#### Year 3

In year 3 this half term our topic has been 'Urban Pioneers'. In this topic



#### Year 4

This half term, Year 4 have been learning about mountains as part of our topic 'Misty Mountain Sierra'. We have enjoyed making our own 3D mountains using different materials. In Geography, we have researched mountain ranges and explored how mountains are formed. As part of our topic, we arranged a walk up the distinctive and iconic landmark Roseberry Topping! We have had a great half term and we are looking forward to our next topic which is 'Road Trip USA.'



### Year 5

We have enjoyed finding out about the history of Middlesbrough. We visited the Dorman Museum and took part in the Town in Time Workshop.



We loved dressing up in Victorian clothing and learning what it would be like to live in Middlesbrough many years ago.

As part of our science topic, we have enjoyed setting up our own investigations about flowering plants. We have worked in groups and are busy collecting results and understanding why things



happen using our growing scientific vocabulary.

### Year 6



Year 6 have had a busy half-term preparing for and sitting their SATs tests in Reading, GPS and Maths. As a reward for all their hard work and also as a learning opportunity for science and history, they visited Preston Hall Museum and Butterfly World.

In Preston Hall, they were able to learn all about Victorian life, ready for their upcoming topic about the Victorians.



Whilst visiting Butterfly World, they had the opportunity to observe many species of butterflies at various stages of their life cycles.





## Extended Services News


### Tour de Yorkshire 'Enjoy the Ride Carnival'
